
Since 1987 the Mor Company has managed BYU's Jerusalem Center in a number of ways. It has provided basic maintenance for the buildings and grounds. The Mor Co. supervises the janitors and other cleaners, the gardeners, and other staff who keep the facility clean and functioning properly. Its maintenance staff includes skilled electricians, mechanics, and carpenters as well as general cleaners and gardeners. Visitors often remark that the building looks not 15 years old but rather brand new. The credit for this goes to the Mor Co. and to its supervisors and employees.
